NavMonster Relaunches Website

NavMonster, a free, web-based application offering flight planning, weather, and airport airspace resources, has relaunched its website. There's also a free app in the Apple store. All weather data comes from FAA sources and is displayed in a color-coded, tabular form. Data includes METARs, TAFs, winds aloft, PIREPs, area forecasts, prognostic charting, and wind gust warnings. Pilots can access data for a current GPS location or route. If viewing a route, NavMonster will show weather for all reporting stations along the route. FMI: navmonster.com
